Traffic Advice

<u>Temporary Traffic and Public Transport Arrangements</u> at East Kowloon Corridor, Kai Tak Tunnel and Kai Fuk Road

Motorists are advised that to facilitate construction works of the Central Kowloon Route, and the regular cleansing, inspection and maintenance works at the Kai Tak Tunnel, the following temporary traffic and public transport arrangements will be implemented from 1.00 am to 5.30 am daily on the following dates at the East Kowloon Corridor, Kai Tak Tunnel and Kai Fuk Road:

(I) Road Closure and Traffic Diversion

(i) 3-5, 9-10, 18-19, 25-26 and 30-31 October 2024:

(a) Road Closures

The following road sections will be temporarily closed to all vehicular traffic:

- (i) the fast lane of the East Kowloon Corridor northbound from near Lok Shan Road to its junction with Kai Tak Tunnel To Kwa Wan portal. Motorists heading for Kowloon City Road northbound could still use the remaining traffic lane;
- (ii) all traffic lanes of the Kai Tak Tunnel Kwun Tong bound from To Kwa Wan portal to Kowloon Bay portal;
- (iii) the only traffic lane of the slip road leading from Kai Fuk Road eastbound to Kai Cheung Road northbound;
- (iv) the only traffic lane of the slip road leading from Kai Cheung Road southbound to Kai Fuk Road westbound;
- (v) the traffic lanes of the section of Kai Fuk Road eastbound from Kai Tak Tunnel Kowloon Bay portal to near Kai Cheung Road.
- (vi) all traffic lanes of the section of Kai Fuk Road westbound from near Kai Cheung Road southbound to Kai Tak Tunnel Kowloon Bay portal; and
- (vii) the fast lane of the section of Kai Fuk Road westbound from near the petrol refilling station to near Kai Cheung Road. Motorists heading for Kai Tak Tunnel Tsim Sha Tsui bound could still use the remaining traffic lane.

(b) Change of Traffic Movements

The traffic lanes of the section of Kai Fuk Road eastbound from Kai Tak Tunnel Kowloon Bay portal to near Kai Cheung Road southbound will be converted to westbound and opened for Tsim Sha Tsui bound motorists.

(c) Traffic Diversions

During the above-mentioned road and traffic lane closure, the following traffic diversions will be implemented:

(i) Vehicles travelling along the East Kowloon Corridor northbound heading to Sung Wong Toi Road and Kowloon East via the Kai Tak Tunnel Kwun Tong bound are advised to divert via the slip road to Kowloon City Road northbound; and (ii) Vehicles travelling along the slip road leading from Kai Cheung Road southbound to Kai Fuk Road westbound are advised to divert via Kai Fuk Road eastbound, Sheung Yee Road eastbound, Wang Chiu Road southbound, Hoi Bun Road eastbound, Shun Yip Street northbound, Wai Yip Street northbound and return to the original route.

(ii) 7 and 21 October 2024

The Kai Tak Tunnel Kwun Tong bound will be temporarily closed to all vehicular traffic. Vehicles travelling along the East Kowloon Corridor northbound heading to Sung Wong Toi Road and Kowloon East via the Kai Tak Tunnel Kwun Tong bound are advised to divert via the slip road to Kowloon City Road northbound.

(iii) 8 and 22-24 October 2024:

(a) Road Closures

The following road sections will be temporarily closed to all vehicular traffic:

- (i) all traffic lanes of the Kai Tak Tunnel Kwun Tong bound from To Kwa Wan portal to Kowloon Bay portal;
- (ii) the only traffic lane of the slip road leading from Kai Fuk Road eastbound to Kai Cheung Road northbound;
- (iii) the only traffic lane of the slip road leading from Kai Cheung Road southbound to Kai Fuk Road westbound;
- (iv) the traffic lanes of the section of Kai Fuk Road eastbound from Kai Tak Tunnel Kowloon Bay portal to near Kai Cheung Road southbound.
- (v) all traffic lanes of the section of Kai Fuk Road westbound from near Kai Cheung Road southbound to Kai Tak Tunnel Kowloon Bay portal; and
- (vi) the fast lane of the section of Kai Fuk Road westbound from near the petrol refilling station to near Kai Cheung Road. Motorists could still use the remaining traffic lane heading for Kai Tak Tunnel Tsim Sha Tsui bound.

(b) Change of Traffic Movements

The traffic lanes of the section of Kai Fuk Road eastbound from Kai Tak Tunnel Kowloon Bay portal to near Kai Cheung Road southbound will be converted to westbound and opened for Tsim Sha Tsui bound motorists.

(c) Traffic Diversions

During the above-mentioned road and traffic lane closure, the following traffic diversions will be implemented:

- (i) Vehicles travelling along the East Kowloon Corridor northbound heading to Sung Wong Toi Road and Kowloon East via the Kai Tak Tunnel Kwun Tong bound are advised to divert via the slip road to Kowloon City Road northbound; and
- (ii) Vehicles travelling along the slip road leading from Kai Cheung Road southbound to Kai Fuk Road westbound are advised to divert via Kai Fuk Road eastbound, Sheung Yee Road eastbound, Wang Chiu Road

southbound, Hoi Bun Road eastbound, Shun Yip Street northbound, Wai Yip Street northbound and return to the original route.

(iv) 14 and 28 October 2024

The Kai Tak Tunnel Tsim Sha Tsui bound will be temporarily closed to all vehicular traffic. One-tube-two-way operation will be implemented at Kai Tak Tunnel Kwun Tong bound.

(v) <u>15-17 and 29 October 2024:</u>

(a) Road Closures

The following road sections will be temporarily closed to all vehicular traffic:

- the fast lane of the East Kowloon Corridor northbound from near Lok Shan Road to its junction with Kai Tak Tunnel To Kwa Wan portal. Motorists heading for Kowloon City Road northbound could still use the remaining traffic lane;
- (ii) all traffic lanes of the Kai Tak Tunnel Kwun Tong bound from To Kwa Wan portal to Kowloon Bay portal;
- (iii) the only traffic lane of the slip road leading from Kai Fuk Road eastbound to Kai Cheung Road northbound;
- (iv) the only traffic lane of the slip road leading from Kai Cheung Road southbound to Kai Fuk Road westbound;
- (v) the traffic lanes of the section of Kai Fuk Road eastbound from Kai Tak Tunnel Kowloon Bay portal to near Kai Cheung Road southbound.
- (vi) all traffic lanes of the section of Kai Fuk Road westbound from near Kai Cheung Road southbound to Kai Tak Tunnel Kowloon Bay portal; and
- (vii) the fast lane of the section of Kai Fuk Road westbound from near the petrol refilling station to near Kai Cheung Road. Motorists could still use the remaining traffic lane heading for Kai Tak Tunnel Tsim Sha Tsui bound.

(b) Change of Traffic Movements

The fast lane of the Kai Tak Tunnel Kwun Tong bound (eastbound) will be converted to one-tube-one-way (westbound) and opened for Tsim Sha Tsui bound motorists.

The traffic lanes of the section of Kai Fuk Road eastbound from Kai Tak Tunnel Kowloon Bay portal to near Kai Cheung Road southbound will be converted to westbound and opened for Tsim Sha Tsui bound motorists.

(c) Traffic Diversions

During the above-mentioned road and traffic lane closure, the following traffic diversions will be implemented:

(i) Vehicles travelling along the East Kowloon Corridor northbound heading to Sung Wong Toi Road and Kowloon East via the Kai Tak Tunnel Kwun Tong bound are advised to divert via the slip road to Kowloon City Road northbound;

- (ii) Vehicles travelling along the slip road leading from Kai Cheung Road southbound to Kai Fuk Road westbound are advised to divert via Kai Fuk Road eastbound, Sheung Yee Road eastbound, Wang Chiu Road southbound, Hoi Bun Road eastbound, Shun Yip Street northbound, Wai Yip Street northbound and return to the original route; and
- (iii) Vehicles travelling along Kai Fuk Road westbound heading for East Kowloon Corridor southbound via the Kai Tak Tunnel Tsim Sha Tsui bound are advised to divert via Kai Tak Tunnel Kwun Tong bound with implementation of one-tube-one-way operation and return to the original route at To Kwa Wan portal.

(II) Public Transport Service Arrangement

During the road closure on 3-5, 7-10, 15-19, 22-26 and 29-31 October 2024, Kowloon Green Minibus route no. 62S heading to Lam Tin (Kwong Tin Estate) will be diverted via Kowloon City Road northbound, Sung Wong Toi Road westbound, Ma Tau Chung Road northbound, Prince Edward Road East eastbound, Kwun Tong Road eastbound, Wai Yip Street flyover southbound, slip road leading to Kai Cheung Road, Kai Cheung Road westbound and Wang Kwong Road northbound, before resuming its original routing in Kai Lai Road eastbound.

Motorists are advised to drive with utmost care and patience. Appropriate traffic signs will be erected to guide motorists. The public transport operators will display notices to advise passengers of the above temporary arrangements.
